

## HOW TO COLLECT BREAD TAGS

1. Decide where you are going to collect. Consider your school, workplace, sports club or church. Think of places where lots of bread and rolls are used such as your local café or school canteen.
2. Get a container such as a 1kg honey tub, 1kg yoghurt container or a jam jar.
3. You can make a moneybox type slot in the top. Put a few bread tags inside to give people the idea.
4. Attach a sign to your container and possibly one on the wall above it – see templates below, and put it in a place where lots of people will see it.
5. Publicise our program in your organisation by email, Facebook or word of mouth.
6. Regularly empty your container – you'll be surprised how quickly it fills up!
7. When it suits you, drop your accumulated bread tags off at one of our collection points. Sorry, but we do not have collection points in all locations yet – check the [map](#) on our website ([www.breadtagsforwheelchairs.co.za](http://www.breadtagsforwheelchairs.co.za)) to see if there is one near you, or otherwise contact us for alternative arrangements. Please include **a gold coin per kilo** of tags to help us get the tags to South Africa.
